**Stephen White** was born on July 27, 1782 in Guilford County, North Carolina. He married Sarah Keziah Conger. Stephen White died between July 9, the day of his last visit to the doctor, and November 1, 1839, the day that the physicians recorded their bill for the Estate of Stephen White with the Justice of the Peace. The White Family Bible reported by Barbara Hook Ward<sup>1</sup> lists the children of Stephen and Sarah Keziah Conger White as:

Allen White, born September 29, 1814 died September 30, 1814 Sarah White, born October 1, 1816 died May 18, 1886

Susannah, born October 24, 1818

Amanda, born November 24, 1820 died after 1846 and before 1850

Rhoda, born February 27, 1823 died July 15, 1828

#### Other children are now known to be:

Sitha born August 8, 1827 died January 21, 1900

Elecarry went West according to Frank Hickenlooper was not heard from again

Leander born September 24, 1829 died October 31 1855 Martha Jane born April 22, 1832 died January 26, 1891

For several years, the White family Bible was in the possession of Elsie White Hook, daughter of Isaac White. Her daughter, Barbara Hook Ward, reported the names and dates of Allen, Sarah, Susannah, Amanda, and Rhoda. After Elsie's death, the Bible was given to the family of Thomas White by Ernest Orval Hook, husband of Elsie White Hook, and it has not been located.<sup>2</sup>

Harry Hickenlooper reported that "*Elecarry and a sister (name not known) died when the children were very young.*" <sup>4</sup> The sister must have been Rhoda that reportedly died in 1828 at the age of five. Some family members reported that Elecarry went west for the Gold Rush and never returned. Elecarry was not mentioned in the closure of the Estate of Stephen White in 1846. An E. White, born in North Carolina, is listed on the 1850 Yuba County, California Census as a miner living in Yuba County. <sup>5</sup>

The Conger family <sup>6</sup> is reported to have come from Yarmouth, England and the first recorded immigrant is John (Belconger) Conger, born in 1633. The family also called Koniger<sup>7</sup> was reported to have been French Huguenots that left the Alsace area of France because of religious reasons and went to Holland and on to England. In 1667 John (1674) reportedly arrived on the ship *Elizabeth Anne*, married Mary Kelly and they settled in Newbury, Massachusetts. They then moved to Woodbridge, New Jersey because of difficulty with the Puritans. The family was Presbyterian at Woodbridge. The parents of Sarah Keziah Conger are not known but some of the Congers of New Jersey moved in about 1750 to Rowan County, North Carolina. John and Mary Kelly and his second wife, Sarah Cawood, (Belconger) Conger had several children including:

Job (1694) married Mary Keziah Thorp in New Jersey and they had several children. One of their children might be the grandparent of Sarah Keziah Conger but this family reportedly stayed in New Jersey.

John (1674) married Mary Turtle Conger and they were the parents of Jonathan (1710), John (1708), Joanna (1712, and Nathaniel (1714). In 1750 John (1708) reportedly moved to Rowan County now Davidson County, North Carolina. John (1708) and his wife, Zipporah Moores Conger, had two sons, Jonathan (born in 1732 in New Jersey), who married Euphemia Ross, and John (born about 1734 in North Carolina), who married Mary Ross.

Jonathan (1710) and Ann Engard Conger had a grandson, Elias Darby Conger, (1763), who married Mary Goble. Elias and Mary Goble Conger's daughter, Sarah Keziah Conger, was born on September 29, 1784. This Sarah Keziah Conger was reported to have married Martin Boner about 1804. Perhaps Martin Boner died and Sarah moved to North Carolina to live with relatives and later married Stephen White. However, the Elias Conger family reportedly stayed in New Jersey. Ruth Conger, daughter of Elias and Mary Goble Conger, married John Fisher and their son, Elias Fisher, married Sarah White, daughter of Stephen and Sarah Keziah Conger White. Sarah Keziah Conger, daughter of Elias and Mary Goble Conger, is a tempting person for the wife of Stephen White. However, as noted below, a daughter of Jonathan (1753), granddaughter of Jonathan (1732), and great granddaughter of John (1708) may be the proper Sarah Keziah White.

Jonathan (1732) and Euphemia Ross Conger had a son, Jonathan (1753), who was born about in North Carolina. Their other children included Benjamin, Isaac, Jean, Elizabeth, and Phebe (sic). No further information is known about Jonathan (1732) and Euphemia Ross Conger's son, Benjamin (about 1755). Isaac (1759) and Susannah Barrett Conger did not have a child named Sarah Keziah Conger. By 1798, their son, Isaac, had moved to Logan County, Kentucky where he married his wife, Susannah Barrett. In 1829 Isaac and Susannah Barrett Conger moved to McLean County, Illinois. Jonathan (1732) is buried in Logan County, Kentucky.<sup>8</sup>

John (1734) and Mary Ross Conger were the parents of Jonathan, Elizabeth, Joshua, Eli, Jean, Isaac, Josiah, Mary, Hannah, and John B. No Sarah Keziah was reported in this family.

Elizabeth Conger (about 1728 in New Jersey), sister of Jonathan (1732) and John (1734), married Nicholas Ross. It postulated but not known if Euphemia, Mary and Nicholas Ross are related.

Jonathan (1753), son of Jonathan (1732), grandson of John (1708) does not have a complete history. Jonathan's (1753) children are not known but they included John, Joshua and "unnamed daughters". Jonathan (1753) is a good possibility as the father of Sarah Keziah Conger, wife of Stephen White.

Stephen White and his family were living in Washington County, Virginia during the 1820 Virginia Census. They were reported in the obituary of Allen White to have "moved to Tennessee in 1822", after Stephen's father, Isaac White, died in 1819. This would indicate that Stephen was still living in Virginia after Isaac White's death. The distance from Washington County, Virginia to Washington County, Tennessee was not great.

Stephen White is found in the 1820 Virginia Census, Washington County, page 48, sheet 1002-1003 listed as follows:

Stephen White would be thirty-six or thirty-eight years of age in 1820.

On February 19, 1821 Stephen White received \$81.50 cents from Terry White, executor of the estate of Isaac White then deceased. <sup>11</sup>

<sup>\*</sup>Rhonda White, daughter of Stephen and Sarah Keziah Conger White, was born on February 27, 1823 and died on July 15, 1828.

Listed adjacent on the Census was David White, a brother. On page 246 of the Census was Thomas and John White, brothers. On page 227 was listed Terry White, Esq., a brother, and a female in the household, age 70-80, who was probably Sarah Conger White. Sarah was the wife of Issac White. Terry White lived in the original Isaac White home with is family and his mother.

Amanda White was born on November 24, 1820 and she died before the 1850 Census. She appears in the 1840 Indiana Census, Hancock County as living the household headed by Allen White. Amanda is listed in the probate of the Stephen White estate for guardianship paid in her behalf and also for money paid to Charles and Amanda Powell. This would indicate that Charles Powell and Amanda White were not married at the beginning of the probate in 1839 but were married by the time the estate was closed in 1846. 12

Stephen and Sarah Keziah Conger White and family moved to Indiana after the 1830 Washington County, Tennessee Census and before the birth of Martha Jane White in 1832 in Indiana. John White, Stephen White's brother, moved with his family from Tennessee to Indiana about this same time according to Fulkerson. <sup>13</sup> The White family belonged to the Missionary Baptist Church. <sup>14</sup>

The 1850 Indiana Census, Boone County, District #7, page 310 lists the following.

The first three children would seem to be from an earlier marriage of Charles Powell as they appear to be too old for his wife, Sarah. The two younger children are a source of speculation but they may be children of Charles E. and Amanda White Powell. This family composition suggests that they were children of Charles and Amanda White Powell as the parents received money from the estate of the Stephen White in 1846 or 1847. The marriage records of Boone County, Indiana list Charles E. Powell and Lydia West marrying on May 17, 1838. The parents of Charles were Isaac and Sarah Powell. Perhaps Charles Powell, that married Lydia West, then married Amanda White, and later Sarah. This would suggest that Amanda White Powell died after 1847 (Birth of Milton--Author) and before the 1850 Census. It is possible that all of the children listed above were from the union of Charles and Amanda White Powell.

Stephen White homesteaded land that was noted on Certificate No.14, 072 on October 2, 1834 in Hancock County, Indiana. This land was recorded as: " the West half of the South West quarter of section Seven in township Seventeen North of range Eight East in the District of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis, Indiana, containing Eighty four acres and twenty two hundredths of an acre". <sup>16</sup>

On September 14, 1841, Allen White purchased "the seventh part of the west half of the south west quarter of section seven in township seventeen north of range eight east in the district of lands subject to sale at Indianapolis containing twelve acres, three hundredths more or less" from "William and Susannah White Long his wife "of the County of Jasper and state of Illinois". This land was one-seventh of the eighty-four and twenty-two hundredths acres of the original Stephen White homestead grant No. 14, 072 and described in exactly the same manner. There were seven known children of Stephen and Sarah Vaughn White at the time of Stephen's death. These children were Allen, Sarah, Susannah, Amanda, Sitha, Leander, and Martha Jane White.

The Government reduced the price of Indiana land to \$1.25 dollars per acre with a minimum purchase of eighty acres. Cash was required for this type of purchase.

After April 22, 1832, when Martha Jane White was born, Sarah Keziah Conger White died. The 1840 Indiana Census lists a child, age five to nine, living in the household headed by Allen White, who was Martha Jane White. Stephen White died on or before November 7, 1839. This was the day the administrators of the estate began their services. The 1840 Indiana Census lists Allen White as head of the household as he was the oldest sibling on the day the Census was recorded, October 22, 1840. Martha Jane White is listed in the 1850 Iowa Census, Des Moines Township, Jefferson County, age 18, as living with Elias and Sarah White Fisher, her sister. Martha Jane White was born in Indiana which further supports the conclusion that Sarah Keziah Conger White died in Indiana.

Martha Jane White married Simon C. Fry about 1852 in Jefferson County, Iowa. Their children included daughters Samantha, Jane, Louisa, Kate, Minnie and Allie. The author believes that Allie was named for Allen White, the oldest brother of Martha Jane White Fry. Allie Fry married Millard Fillmore Taylor and their children included Russell, Hazel, Florence, and Fern. Russell Taylor married Willa Blanche McClure and they were the parents of James Taylor. Simon C. and Martha Jane White Fry are buried in the Fell Cemetery, near Libertyville, Des Moines Township,

Jefferson County, Iowa.

Sarah White Fisher was born on October 1, 1816, died on May 18, 1886, and is buried in the Selection Cemetery, Monroe County, Iowa. Her husband, Elias Fisher, <sup>18</sup> was born on December 10, 1812, died on June 3, 1878, and is also buried in the Selection Cemetery, Monroe County, Iowa. Elias Fisher signed a will on June 2, 1878 and William A. Fisher was the executor. The heirs included Sarah, Jessy, William A., and George Fisher. A sale occurred on November 18, 1878 of the chattel property. Those purchasing items included Elcarry White, A. White, Elwood White, George Fisher, and William Fisher. Interest on notes due was ten per cent. <sup>19</sup> <sup>20</sup>

The Probate of Stephen White's Estate reports that the White siblings were boarded out. <sup>21</sup> This occurred after October 1840 when the Census was completed as the siblings were in the Allen White household at that time. The White siblings were probably placed in guardianship of Seth Walker after Allen White's marriage in 1841. The probate of the Stephen White estate lists office visits to Dr. Darell and Simon Alten from September 19, 1838 to July 9, 1939 for medicine, visits, cinnamon, bleeding, spirits nitric and pills. The listing of Stephen White's account at the E. Thornburgh & Co. store lists many entries for saltz (sic) and, just before his death, for the purchase of whiskey. This would indicate that he suffered from an abdominal condition or perhaps a malignancy and was treating the associated pain. Sarah Keziah Conger White may have been the victim of an epidemic such as the second cholera pandemic which spread throughout the United States from 1826-1837.

Paid said out and expended in the payments outstanding debts against said estate by said administrators the amount of ninety nine dollars and seventy nine cents and 3/4 and also paid to the heirs of said estate to wit To Amanda Powell Thirty four dollars six ½ cents To Sitha Haise Thirty three dollars and sixty eight 3/4 cents To Susannah Long Seventeen Dollars and fifty cents To Leander White fourteen dollars seventy nine ¼ cents To Martha J White Thirteen Dollars sixty ¾ cents. Making this total amount paid out by said Administrators of one hundred and six dollars and seven ½ cents making the total amount paid out by said administrators to creditors and heirs of two hundred and six dollars thirty seven ½ cents and the said administrators were allowed the sum of forty dollars and seventy five cents for their services in administration upon said estate, which makes the total expended in payments of debts and heirs of two hundred and forty seven dollars and twelve ½ cents, leaving no assets in the hands of said administrators to be administrated, It also appears that the said administrators recused a note of hand on Mashick Hale Twenty two dollars and fifty cents, which said administrators places on file in this Court said as disperat(sic) for the benefit of said heirs or said estate, which said note is ordered by said Court remain on file until called for by same of said heirs of said estate, now this day to wit.

The 18<sup>th</sup> day of August AD 1846, upon satisfactory proof to said court that publication has been made in the Indiana State Journal a weekly newspaper published at Indianapolis Indiana according to Law of the final settlement and distribution of said estate, and the said heirs being three times called comes not and no course being showed why said estate should not be settled. It is ordered and adjuded(sic) that said administrators be discharged from further administration of said estate.

These records clearly show that Allen, Susannah, Amanda, Sitha, Martha J. and Leander are

siblings and are the children of Stephan White. The marriages of Amanda to Charles Powell, Susannah to William Long, and Sitha to Hillah Hayes are reported. Martha J. White is the child listed in the 1840 Census in the biography of Allen White as being age five to nine. Mary Hickenlooper wrote that the children were "boarded out to neighbors". <sup>23</sup>

The author reviewed the records of Hancock County, Indiana of Hays and Harlan (Concord) Baptist cemeteries and no record of Stephen White was not found. The Hays Cemetery was heavily vandalized and many stones were destroyed or severely damaged. Stephen White is probably buried in the Hayes Cemetery. Betty Ruth White Baker and the author found the grave stone of Sarah McQueary Baldwin, mother of Elizabeth Baldwin, at the edge of the Hays Cemetery. In 1831 the McQueary family owned the land that the Hays Cemetery now occupies. Rachel McQueary, who died in October 29, 1834 at the age of 26, was reported to be the earliest identified grave. Achel was the sister-in-law of Sarah McQueary who was the mother of Elizabeth Baldwin. Elizabeth Baldwin married Allen White, the son of Stephen White. The author belives that Stephen and Sarah White were buried in the Hays cemetery because of this close family relationship. Sarah and Stephen White also lived very close to the cemetery.
